## Commit to growing the parish

THE next two months will hopefully see significant developments in our drive to "grow the parish".

Firstly, the new Parish Council will meet with Bishop Jeremy and community building expert Allan Tranter on August 21 and then on September 10, Bishop Jeremy and Mr Tranter meet with the parish to seek input and ideas for moving forward together.

At the Parish Consultation with Bishop Jeremy in 2021, parishioners shared thoughts and ideas on growing the parish and committed

to developing a blueprint for moving forward with

positivity and energy.

Following that meeting, the Parish Council accepted an offer by Bishop Jeremy to seek the services of Mr Tranter. The parish council had met the bishop and Mr Tranter on two occasions, but a third

meeting has been arranged to bring the new council up-to-date on the proposal. Mr Tranter comes with a wealth of experience in working with diverse community and corporate bodies to enable the building of positive

and forward-thinking groups and communities. He is co-founder of Creating Communities Australia with wife Donna, and both are directors. Mr Tranter, who is offering his services pro-bono, grew up in Midvale, so he has a deep-rooted sense of belonging and understanding of this area, its geography. The parish engagement" on September 11 will start the real process of moving forward and growing our future, both financially and physically and also as a witnessing and caring community. This meeting will start at 3pm so please come along and commit.

## APPEAL TO MARK COBY'S LOSS

TO mark the death of her husband Andrew 12 months ago, Coby Aylmore will be trying to raise as much money as possible during August for Multiple Myeloma Australia.

August 28 is the first anniversary of Andrew's death to multiple myeloma, an aggressive form of cancer which affects the bone marrow.

For the next three Sundays, Coby will be fund-raising at St Mary's, where she is a regular worshipper with baby Lucy, born after Andrew died. Lucy was baptised in St Mary's on April 24.
